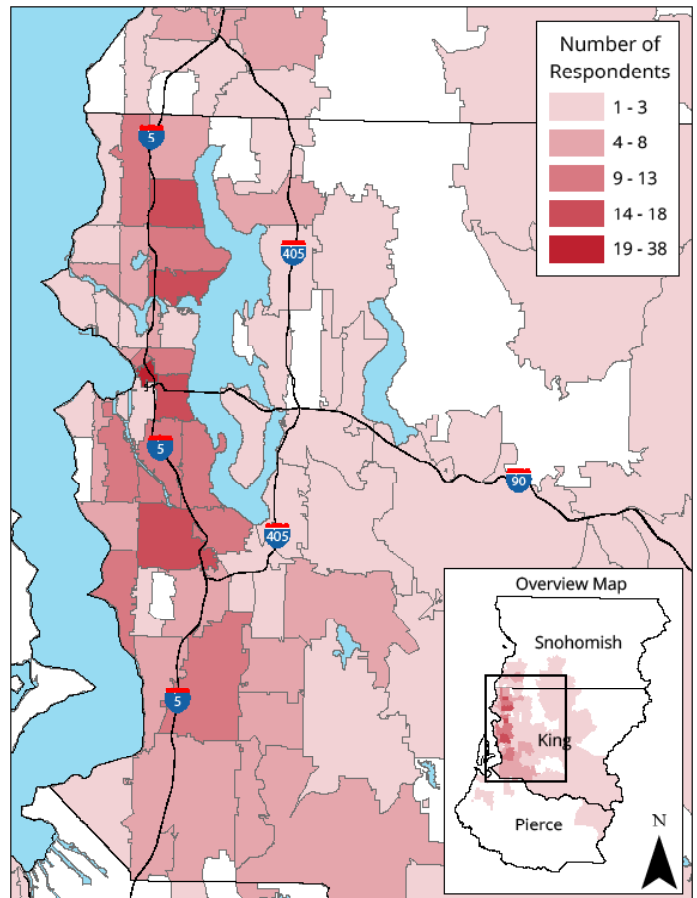

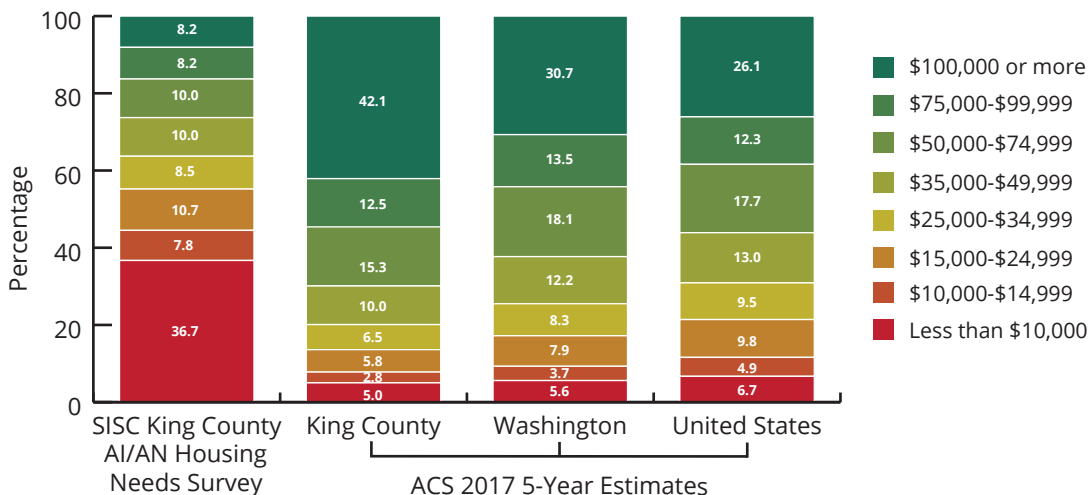

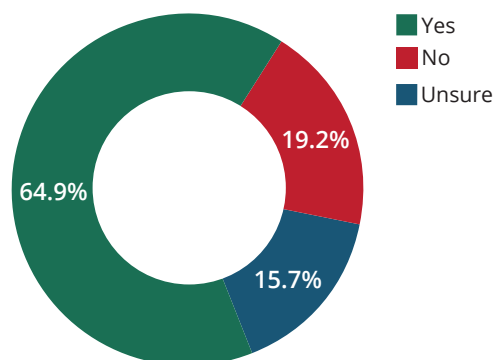

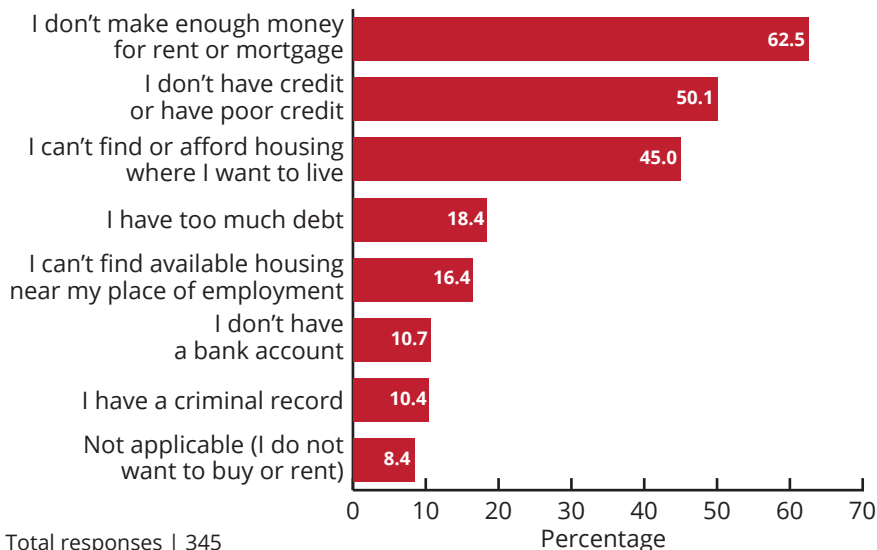

Top Barriers When Looking for a Home

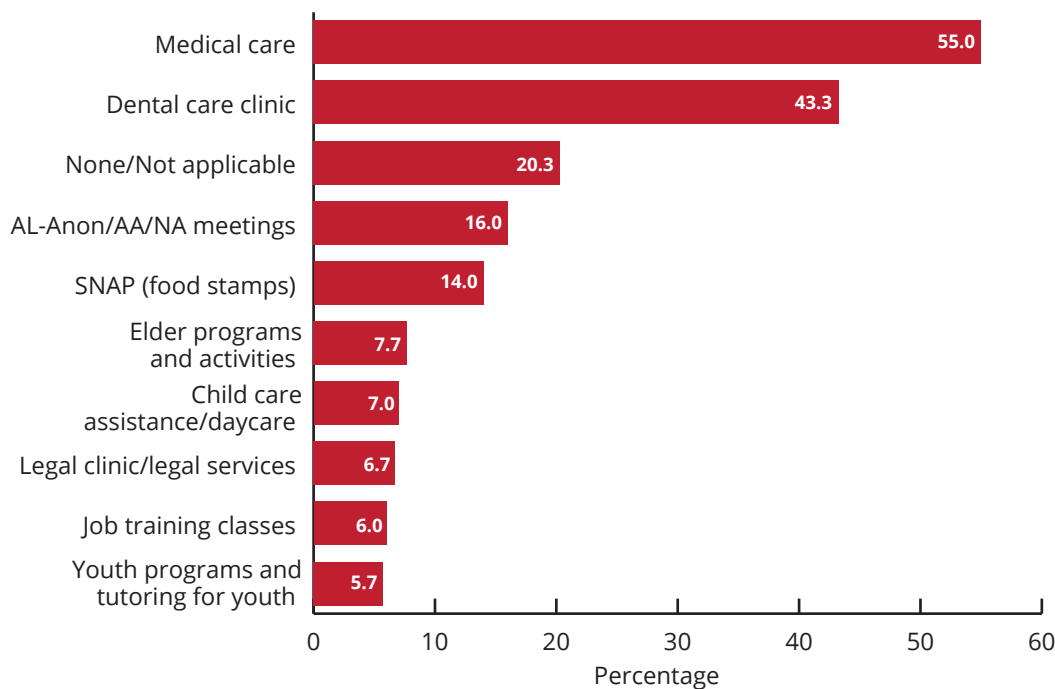

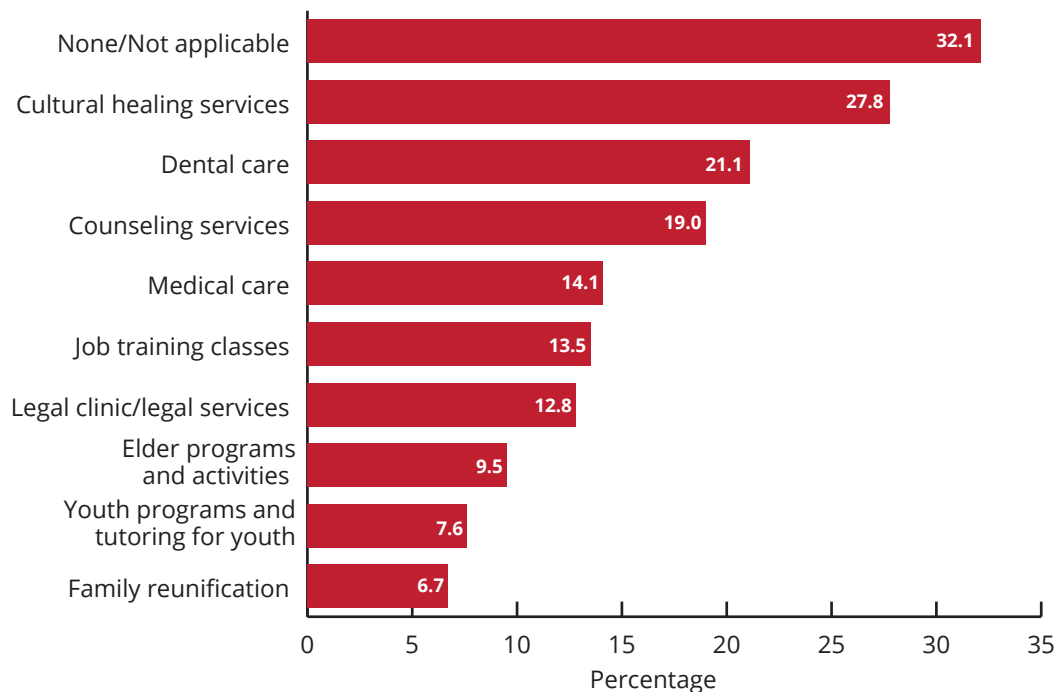
